



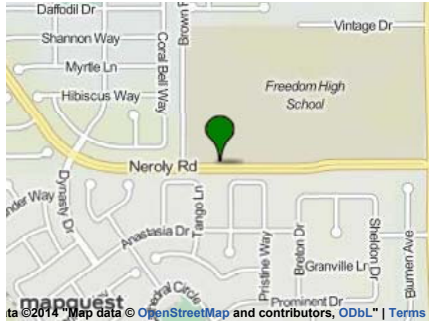

SCHOOL PROFILE 2013-2014

School and Community

Freedom High School (FHS) was opened in 1996 as the second of 3 comprehensive high schools in the Liberty Union High School District, serving the residential areas of Brentwood, Byron, Oakley and Bethel Island and accredited by the Western Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. The academic year is based on a modified calendar starting the last week in July and ending in June, with two-week breaks between each quarter. Grading periods are based on two semesters of 18 weeks each. The school offers an 8-period block schedule, alternating between "A" and "B" days (periods 1-4 and 5-8, respectively.) Counselors' caseloads are approximately 850 students per counselor.

FHS is located in the city of Oakley, a rural-suburban setting which has experienced rapid residential and commercial development over the past decade. Freedom's student population has grown from approximately 1690 in 2001 to over 2611 students. However, the recent economic down-turn of the past several years has significantly impacted the local economy and the families served by our district. Despite increased challenges, academic performance index (API) values have consistently increased over the same period. FHS has focused on raising achievement level for all students, while narrowing the gap for our five targeted sub-groups, Hispanic, English Language Learners (ELL), Special Education (SPED), African American, and Socio-Economically Disadvantaged (SED) students. We have 34% of population receiving free and reduced lunch.

Staff

Freedom High School features an average class size of 29 students. There are 111 certificated teaching staff, plus a principal, 4 assistant principals, 3 counselors, a school psychologist and a part-time librarian. There are 45 classified staff, including secretaries, technical support workers and campus supervisors.

Students successfully completing a class (with grade of D or better) are awarded 5.0 credits per semester. Advance Placement (AP) classes are weighted and class ranking is determined using a weighted GPA.

Curriculum

College Preparatory and Advanced Placement courses: A "p" designation before the class title denotes that this is a University of California approved college preparatory course. Advanced Placement courses (denoted by "AP") are offered in American Government, Art History, Biology, Calculus, Economics, English 3, English 4, Psychology, Spanish, U.S. History and World History.

Ninth and Tenth Grade Core

Students are randomly assigned to one of the four (4) building communities and remain throughout their tenure at FHS. The building communities feature common core teachers in English and Social Studies, as well as an Assistant Principal, Counselor and Secretary. This structure allows students to experience a smaller school within a large school setting and a more personal and supportive educational community. FHS embraces the PLC (Professional Learning Community) model, which encourages varying groups of staff to collaborate and work towards a common goal of improving student learning outcomes.

Academy Program

There are three academies in place for the 2012-2013 school year, each with a particular focus and career paths. The FHS Academies programs are Communications (formerly Arts and Media) for majors in mass media, music/theater arts, visual commercial art and business; "STEM" (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math, *formerly BETA*) majors in biotechnology, computer technology, architecture, engineering and construction; and "PHD" (Professional Human Development) majors in education, protective services and social services.

The Academy goals are to provide students, at the completion of high school, the option of entering the job market, enrolling at a community college/technical school, or pursuing collegiate studies with a clearly articulated academic background in a particular area.
